

E-Signature Options for Financial Counsellors Working from Home

Overview

We have researched various options for clients to electronically sign the standard FCA Third Party Authorisation. The options are divided into free and paid services and explained below.

These options could also be useful for other purposes, for example signing settlement agreements.

DocuSign stores data in Australia so it might be the best paid option.

Please note that FCA have established a DocuSign account for financial counsellors. To use DocuSign via FCA’s account at no cost, go to the [E-signatures for client authorities page](#) in the case administration section of the Toolkit.

How does it work?	<p>Open PDF in Adobe Acrobat Reader. From the Fill & Sign toolbar, click the Sign icon and then select the option to add Signature. Acrobat Reader allows you to type, draw or upload an image of your signature. After adding your signature, save the PDF in your preferred location.</p>	<p><u>Click here to create a free Jotform account</u> or <u>click here to create your own form</u> using FCA’s template.</p> <p>Once you have set up your account, you can email client/s a link to the form. It will open as a webpage on a phone, tablet or computer and the client can sign with their finger on the screen (or mouse if using a computer). After the form has been completed, the client will be asked to ‘Submit’ and the Jotform account holder will receive notification via email.</p> <p>You can also send forms by text message and they can be signed offline.</p>	<p>For anyone using Apple products (iPhone, iPad or a Mac computer), it is possible to add a signature to a PDF file or manually sign a document in a number of pre-installed applications including Mail, Photos, Safari, Notes, Files.</p> <p>You can move the signature to wherever you want on the document, and you can add text, highlights or even draw on it.</p> <p>More information on apps that support Markup, and a step by step guide here.</p>

How does it work?	<p>Recipients click a link to open the form on an internet-enabled device (like a mobile phone, tablet, or computer).</p> <p>Tabs and simple instructions guide the user through the signing process, even adopting an electronic signature. The recipient clicks Finish to save the signed document.</p>	<p>Click here to create a free Jotform account</p> <p>Once you have set up your account, you can email client/s a link to the form. It will open as a webpage on a phone, tablet or computer and the client can sign with their finger on the screen (or mouse if using a computer). After the form has been completed, the client will be asked to ‘Submit’ and the Jotform account holder will receive notification via email.</p> <p>You can also send forms by text message and they can be signed offline.</p>	<p>A financial counsellor could fill out the form on the phone/video with the client - which is what would happen in a face to face appointment - and then send the PDF to the client to sign using Adobe Sign.</p> <p>Once the client/s had signed the form, it would be sent back to the financial counsellor. Security	DocuSign uses secure cloud storage.
